## The AMF and ACP issue a warning concerning the Hungarian Financial Supervisory Authority's decision to partly suspend the approval of iFOREX

The Hungarian Financial Supervisory Authority has notified France's authorities of its decision to apply a six-month suspension, beginning on 7 July 2011, to the approval issued to the Hungarian firm iForex (corporate name: *iFOREX Befektetési Szolgáltató Zrt.*) to provide order reception/transmission, order execution and asset management services to third parties. The company, which offers retail investors, notably French residents, the ability to trade on the foreign exchange market through its website (<a href="http://www.iforex.fr/">http://www.iforex.fr/</a>), may longer propose new contracts on this market. The company is however required to honour all commitments under existing agreements. This decision<sup>1</sup>, which has been appealed in the Home Member State, applies in France under the conditions provided for by the Home Member State.

As a consequence, and as long as the abovementioned approval is suspended, the Autorité de Contrôle Prudentiel (ACP) and the Autorité des Marchés Financiers (AMF) warn investors not to respond to any offers from iForex and to refrain from passing them on to third parties in any form.

Under the agreement signed between the AMF and the Autorité de Régulation Professionnelle de la Publicité (ARPP, France's self-regulatory organisation for advertising) on enhancing the concerted regulation of financial-product advertising (<a href="http://www.amf-france.org/documents/general/9989">http://www.amf-france.org/documents/general/9989</a> 1.pdf), the ARPP has been informed of the Hungarian Financial Supervisory Authority's decision, which legally bars iForex from offering the abovementioned investment services on French territory, in particular by means of advertising.
